**TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR THOSE INTENDING
TO TEACH AT UNIVERSITY LEVEL**

Many postgraduate students in European universities are not involved in teaching while undertaking their studies. However they are then expected to begin teaching as soon as they have completed their programmes. With little or no training and limited material resources they are often left alone to face these challenges. To address this issue, Prof. Dr. Beate Kowalski from TU Dortmund University and Sr. Dr. Mary Julit Mandumpala CMC at the Pontifical Athenaeum in Bangalore (DVK) have designed a **Training Programme for Academics**.

Students in licentiate and doctoral programmes at **Faculties of Theology in Rome** are invited to participate in this workshop.

Topics will include: **the role of the teacher, taxonomy models, learning objectives, course design and class preparation, teaching methods, preparation of teaching material and methods of assessment**. Students will be invited to reflect on the best teaching practices specifically in relation to the various cultures in which they will be required to teach in the future.
